Dear CPC Family,

Each November, we ask you to prayerfully consider making a financial commitment to CPC for the coming year. Making a pledge is more than writing down a number: it's about demonstrating a commitment to trust God with your finances and invest in His work at CPC and in the community and worldwide ministries we support.

We also believe pledging is an outflow of living missionally. Our current "My 95" worship series challenges us to integrate our faith into the 95% of our lives we spend outside church. Living missionally is about letting the gospel shape our whole lives, not just parts of it, and seeking to love and bless others with our time, our decisions, and our finances.

Enclosed is a pledge card, which we ask you to fill out and bring to worship on November 21-22. The pledge card also shares two graphs that show the importance of pledged gifts in CPC's annual budget planning, as well as the breadth of programs and ministries your gifts support. Our current budget stands at just over \$5 million, which represents an approximate 10% drop from last year's budget. Due to the economic realities of the past year, we had to reduce some positions and programs, but we praise God that His faithfulness continues to multiply your gifts for great impact.
